1. MAKE 3D LSB THE MOST READY, CAPABLE AND RESILIENT FORCE

2. PROFESSIONAL & PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT OF MARINES AND SAILORS

- Know your people; leverage strengths and weaknesses to build a winning hand.
- Mentor, develop and educate Marines and Sailors into confident and capable leaders.
- Develop Marines of action- they need to have a bias for action and need to make decisions themselves.
- Train to standard; in a smart, deliberate fashion.
- Don't accept answers that you do not understand-you need to have professional curiosity.
- Hold Marines and Sailors accountable but never take away a person's dignity.

3. TAKE PRIDE IN OUR CORPS AND YOURSELF

- Take pride in our Marine Corps- our history, traditions, and the impact you have on our legacy.
- The red patch symbolizes responsibility and expertise, necessitating unwavering adherence to standards; wear it proudly.
- Carry our ethos on and off duty. It is not enough to be a good person; you must be a good Marine.
- We will perform our mission across the globe-carry yourself as an ambassador wherever you go.
- Hold yourself and others accountable, not only for actions, but also lack of action.
- Never forget that your uniform has two names on it- U.S. Marines and your family name.
