

Safety Mission Policy Statement

7 September 2024



The profession of arms is hazardous and presents risk of injury, illness, and equipment damage. The ability of 3d Marine Logistics Group (3D MLG) to support III Marine Expeditionary Force's mission to "FIGHT NOW" requires protecting and preserving the most important assets of the United States Marine Corps: personnel, property, and family. An effective Safety and Risk Management System must be implemented and constantly enforced by all leaders for us to achieve our mission.

All Hands are Responsible for Force Safety

I expect all 3D MLG personnel to be "Proactive Safety Advocates," that contribute to the development of a positive Safety Culture. Most mishaps are a result of human error, apply approved standard operating procedures and risk management principles on and off duty to ensure human errors are minimized. You must always hold yourself accountable and hold your team accountable for decisions that affect the safety and well-being of your fellow Marines, Sailors, and civilian teammates. Immediately report any unsafe or unhealthy conditions, at-risk behaviors, and unsafe conditions. If you notice a hazard or behavior with the potential to injure or kill someone or damage property, fix it. If you cannot fix it, report it immediately to your chain of command and apply the proper interim mitigation to reduce the risk.

Leadership is Imperative for Safety Stewardship

I challenge all supervisors to enforce adherence to safety precautions, maintenance procedures, and risk management. Safety and risk management do not hinder mission accomplishment, rather, they are force multipliers. Supervise, conduct training, and encourage the use of engineering controls, administrative controls, and personal protective equipment. Be proficient in tactical equipment operation, plan-ahead, use ground guides, and pay attention to details.

Risk Management Enables Force Resiliency

Finally, I am committed to protecting the force. Every safe action we take is our own definitive choice that can save your life and the lives of your fellow Marines, Sailors, and Civilians. Committing to making better risk decisions will lead to more quality time with our family and allow for experiencing the things we love the most to live a more meaningful life. Do not let your guard down and be ever vigilant. Semper Fidelis!

Complaints can be filed using the informal or formal resolution system. Reprisal or acts of intimidation related to a complaint will result in disciplinary or administrative action. False allegations will also be subject to disciplinary action. Assistance is available through your chain of command, your unit Equal Opportunity Coordinator or your unit Equal Opportunity Advisor.

Sexual Assault Prevention & Response Policy Statement

7 September 2024



Minimizing the number of Sexual Assaults across 3D Marine Logistics Group is paramount and will remain the focus. All members within the unit must understand that sexual assault is a serious crime that can significantly damage the physical and mental health of personnel. Sexual Assault is defined as intentional sexual contact, characterized using force, physical threat of force, abuse of authority, or when the victim does not or cannot consent. 3D MLG's leadership will remain prevention focused by encouraging education and training, through our Sexual Assault personnel.

All personnel must realize:

- For protection of confidentiality contact the SARC or SAPR VA first.
- Sexual Assault can be reported as Restricted, Unrestricted.
 - A Restricted Report allows the victim to receive the medical, advocacy, and counseling support without notification of law enforcement or the command. A Restricted Report can be made to a Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC), SAPR Victim Advocate (VA), Healthcare Provider (HCP), the DoD Safe Helpline 24/7 (877-995-5247), or a local Installation Support Line 645-4673. With a restricted Report, the victim's identity remains confidential, and information is not reported to law enforcement or the chain of command.
 - An Unrestricted Report also allows a victim to receive medical, advocacy, and counseling services. In addition, an official investigation into the crime will be initiated. An Unrestricted Report can be made to law enforcement or the command, as well as to a SARC, SAPR VA, HCP, or Helpline. Although the victim's identity will not remain confidential, the circle of need-to-know will remain small and limited to only those who are directly involved with victim care.
- Consent is not given when a person uses force, coercion, or when the victim is asleep, incapacitated, or unconscious or does not resist.
- Sexual assault can occur regardless of gender or relationship.

Maintaining trust with our Marines and Sailors is our cornerstone and confirms our commitment, ensuring each of us live in a safe environment.
